**January 4:** School resumed. Most students and all the staff seemed eager to be back. Several did express appreciation for the three day week which seemed to help with the transition back to school routines and procedures.

**January 9-13:** A representative from the District Health Department #10 was on site to perform hearing (kindergarten, 2nd and 4th grades) and vision (1st, 3rd, and 5th grades) screening for students. If time allowed, the goal was to perform additional screenings by teacher recommendation i.e. vision screen a second grader that may be displaying difficulties.

**January 11:** I attended, virtually, the sixth and final day of training on the 5D+ Rubric for Instructional Growth & Teacher Evaluation. This is my second time completing this training, but I still was able to glean important information both about the rubric and the processes for teacher evaluation.

**Enrollment:** You will notice in the table below that we experienced an enrollment “boom” of sorts. Nearly all of this change happened after we returned from Christmas Break. The staff are working diligently to re-teach expectations, routines, and procedures to all returning students as well as teaching these to 13 new students.

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The Special Education numbers have dropped the last three years due, in a large part, to more implementation of Universal Supports and greater implementation of interventions prior to referral.
