August 22 & 23: The staff at MSE participated in professional development and team meetings to prepare for the start of the school year. On the 23rd, the staff spent time with James Layman who worked to help us understand "How to people, with people, again." Included in this time was tips for effective communication and the effective and appropriate use of humor.

August 29: This was the first day of school for students and went very well. Because we were unable to have a before school open house, I allowed parents to walk students down to classrooms on the 29th and 30th. This seemed to ease most concerns and allowed us to push our Open House date back to the 22nd where we can hopefully show off the building.

August 31-September 9: The staff at MSE have worked with students to complete required beginning of the year benchmark assessments. With the exception of a few make-ups the assessments have been completed. We will now transition to forming intervention groups and processing that collected data.

September 12-14: MSE will be hosting the Farm Bureau Farm Science Lab. 2nd to 5th grade classrooms will get to head out to the lab to participate in science exploration and agriculture. I believe that this will be a great opportunity for our students to participate in science and expand their knowledge.

On-going Matters:

Kindergarten Enrollment: Kindergarten enrollment is up slightly at the elementary. Currently we have 75 kindergarten students. This follows two classes that were in the low to mid 60s. Kindergarten teachers are feeling this increase and I have been in discussion with Mr. Cole about a couple of possible solutions to support them. **Construction**: Most of the construction has wrapped up and the Christman Company superintendent is no longer on site. There are a few remaining projects that will be happening in the upcoming days and weeks. This includes carpeting the one stretch of hallway that is not yet carpeted and replacing the carpet that was cut out from the corner, mounting of whiteboards once they arrive in mid October, painting some bulkheads.

Old classroom furniture has been staged in the northside of the elementary while we await the end of the online auction. Once the remaining items of new furniture are delivered, this process may need to be repeated.
