August 14-17: 16 incoming kindergarten students and several staff members participated in Ready for K Camp. These students participated in early academic skills, learned classroom routines and procedures, navigated the school and much more. Students were also sent home with a picture book each day as well as a t-shirt. Parents have responded positively to a follow-up survey indicating that the event was beneficial for their children and themselves. I am hopeful that we can continue to make this event happen in the future.

August 17: I attended MiPSE Transfer of Student Data training with several MSCS staff as well as staff from other local schools. This training focused on the new special education platform and the process for ensuring a continuity of services for students that are enrolling with an IEP. Since that training, Lori Bruggema, Amy Rose, and I have worked closely to create a plan for accomplishing this process.

August 21: The staff at MSE kicked off the year by working with colleagues to examine instructional standards. Led by Zach Ripley, Communications by Design, teams were asked to rank from 1 to X the academic standards for given grade range and subject area. This work represents the first step of the district's multi-year transition to Standards-Based Instruction. While the elementary school has engaged in this work since before my time here, this work will strengthen our practices and will support common understandings.

August 21: MSE hosted our back to school open house. This was the first "normal" open house in 4 years. 2021 was held in the MS/HS cafetorium and 2022 was delayed. Both due to construction. 2020 there was no Open House due to concerns about COVID-19.

August 22: Staff from MSE participated in Blue Envelope training. This training was provided by staff from Corewell Health. Blue Envelope training provided an awareness of youth suicide and a process for obtaining additional assistance using a standardized process. Some staff participated in Level 2 training which provided additional training on how to respond to a student that has expressed suicidal ideation.

August 23: Staff and students alike celebrated the 1st Day of School.

August 28-31: Mrs. Estes and the Title I paraprofessionals wrapped up nearly all of the FastBridge Fall Benchmark assessing. This data will be used to monitor student growth, identify students for Title I services, and more.
